"It does take a little effort to keep them looking good but it's worth it. One key point is to have a couple coats of a good sealant or wax on them and wipe them down when you're done. I use speed gloss and others here have had good success with hot sauce."

Is that true?

Not sure about the hot sauce, but shipwright and CYA member Wayne Ettel otherwise concurs. "Black hulls are not good in Southern California waters as the seams crack more quickly. This is due to the black color becoming hotter and drying out the hull."



the bridge has a somewhat steep descent, sways under footsteps, and is just a bit scary.

Winter Reading: Queen Mary

The RMS Queen Mary, a storied vessel that transported the elite across the North Atlantic, also served as a legendary troop transport ("the largest and fastest") during World War II, made 13 voyages after the war carrying 20,000 war brides and their children, and now resides in Long Beach, California.

The QUEEN MARY is an Affiliate Member of the Southern California Fleet.

The following is excerpted from the IMAGES OF AMERICA series of historic local interest books.

In 1944 a British soldier found himself clinging to a raft in high seas when his ship was torpedoed by a German submarine. As he lay there, the QUEEN MARY came by. Its commanding officer sent this message to the almost drowned victims: "Sorry. Cannot stop! Will report your position"

The father of the stranded Englishman happened to be the chief engineer of the QUEEN MARY. When he visited his wife after this particular trip, he had the pleasure of reading the following in a letter his son had sent to his mother: "Our ship was torpedoed and sunk by the Germans. We drifted on a raft for several days while awaiting rescue. Then there came into our distracted view the good old QUEEN MARY, and we knew that we would be saved. But the chief engineer, my useless father, would not stop to pick us up. Why don't you get a divorce?"

Rachel: Joey, that is the Coast Guard.



DID YOU KNOW?


THE SMITHSONIAN confirms that the only appetizer famed chef Julia Child ever set out was goldfish crackers.
