

The Captivating Catalina Casino



More than 100 years ago in 1919, chewing gum magnate William Wrigley Jr. bought the controlling stake in Catalina Island, 26 miles off the shores On May 29, 1929, the Catalina Casino was of Southern California. completed under the involved direction of Wrigley with architect David M. Renton. Its design combines Art Deco and Mediterranean Revival styles and towers the equivalent of 12 stories tall.

A "casino" in the word's traditional meaning but never a gambling establishment, the casino's main floor movie theater was the first to be designed specifically for "talkies" - those new films with sound. Silver-leaf stars twinkled from the ceiling like the harbor sky while movie moguls moored their yachts nearby.

On the upper floor is the world's largest circular ballroom - so big that during a typical waltz on a crowded floor, a dancer only travels around one-and-a-half times. French doors open to an exterior portico to keep the dancers cool or to provide a romantic interlude gazing across the bay.

The Catalina Casino @ Avalon



It was on Catalina that Norma Jean Baker may have realized how attractive she was to opposite sex and began the her transformation into Marilyn Monroe. Norma Jean married her neighbor James Dougherty at 16 to avoid being sent to more foster homes and orphanages.

The pair moved to Catalina Island in 1943 at a time the island was inhabited by multitudes of sailors and Norma Jean loved the Dougherty attention! stated, "I would marvel at how she'd 'turn on' when she was walking



and knew men were looking at her. She'd do 'the walk' seen later in millions of her films, but back then, she was just learning to do it, and she was very, very good at it!"

Wrigley, who also owned Wrigley Field, the home of his Chicago Cubs baseball team, devised a very interesting way to get a large number of people into and out of the dance area. The basement level houses restrooms, a large lounge, and locker area for dancers to store their cloaks and street shoes. That many floors of stairs would be very hard on dancers' knees, so a wide ramp - just like at the baseball stadium - allows crowds of people to move in and out quickly. Gotta catch that ferry!



DAST EVENTS – FLEET WEEK

"The Cut", *a prime location* next to the LOS ANGELES MARITIME MUSEUM, was reserved for classic yachts of the Southern California Fleet for **FLEET WEEK 2023** at the fascinating PORT OF LOS ANGELES during Memorial Day weekend. Well, we all have our reasons but for one reason or another, none of our yachts were able to attend. Truly a shame because those warm wood hues and red CASSIC YACHT burgees would have really stood out against the U.S. COAST GUARD cutter on display and would have drawn positive public attention to CYA.

Former Commodores *Jim Kroeger* and *Janet Beggs*, accompanied by the SEA BOARDER'S Line Lassie, did their best to represent the CASSIC YACHT (SSOCIATION and had a wonderful tour of the TERRELL HORNE. This is one of the most recently commissioned cutters in the COAST GUARD, built to patrol territorial waters and other search, rescue, and enforcement activities. We learned that most of this crew's dangerous missions are either drug smugglers or people entering the United States illegally via its water borders. They explained that their telescope can see very accurately for miles and that -- for example -- they can see inside a vessel and read the label on your cereal box. This tool is an important aid to identify traffickers and the dangers on board. Their small Zodiak style support boat exits the rear of the ship quickly and in the dark at high speeds. As the TERRELL HORNE is a humanitarian vessel, it has never used its FN M240 machine gun, but it does exist and has a remarkable long range accuracy if needed. We also saw the mess area where the crew takes their meals, but which reverts to a surgical center if needed. When asked, their Water Rescue & Dive Officer said that his greatest concern in a water rescue is how to deal with people who are panicked.


