


## Note from the Bridge, Commodore, Dennis Ballard

Fleet Captain and Newsletter Editor. Many thanks from the fleet to Commodore Tom


Brown for a job well done in 2008.

The waters edge hotel had a nice little room in the lobby where they served wine and cheese every afternoon. It seemed that here was where we always hooked up with







Speaking of sunshine, our Northern California friends got

Cocktails were served in the "China Cabin" a completely restored deck cabin that is all

that is left of the SS CHINA. The SS CHINA was a transpacific deluxe steam ship built in New York in 1867. This was the height of luxury travel and was used for quick trips around the horn to San Francisco and across the Pacific to the Orient. The inside of

the China Cabin is a gold gilded wooden masterpiece.

Saturday and Sunday morning's meetings were held at the nearby San Francisco Yacht Club. On Saturday afternoon 15 of us took a ferry across the bay and toured the Liberty Ship JEREMIAH O'BRIEN in her berth at Fisherman's Wharf. Saturday evening's tra-

ditional Change of Watch banquet was held upstairs in Servino's Restaurant just a few doors away from the hotel. We were entertained by the 21-man singing group "The Son's of the Sea" from the San Francisco Yacht Club. The gavel and command were passed from Commo-

dore David Gillespie to new Commodore Jim Sweeney.









It was very cool, actually it was hot, seeing the huge crankshaft and connecting rods flying by at a blistering 28 RPMs. \*\*\* The Northern California Fleet also took us to Old Town Sacramento and to the California State Railroad Museum. This was an amazing

look back at the history of the railroads around the times of our Classic Yachts. I would call this a "must see" next time your in Sacramento. \*\*\*
